What a year it has been for the Sacramento Philharmonic & Opera – and I cannot thank you enough for the instrumental role you played in our success!

Your support for the Sacramento Philharmonic & Opera truly allowed us to continue our vital work of building community, inspiring a love of the performing arts, and enriching lives through music. As you read about the SP&O's impact in our first ever Impact Report, I hope you'll join me in feeling a sense of pride in knowing your essential involvement in our accomplishments.

Our 2024-25 season brought exciting growth and new opportunities for audience engagement at the SAFE Credit Union Performing Arts Center, and throughout the Sacramento Region:

- Through our Link Up! Music education program, the SP&O helped more than 6,000 students receive their start to a music education, and 3,000 of these students perform live in concert with our SP&O musicians over the course of four performances at the SAFE PAC
- Through expanded partnerships with the Sacramento Ballet and the City of Sacramento, we performed the live music for all performances of the Nutcracker and the Ballet's Romeo & Juliet; and performed the live music for Harry Potter and the Chamber of Secrets while the movie played for 4,000 attendees over two concerts.
- Additionally, our SP&O Brass Quintet again performed for 30,000 runners at the Run
 to Feed the Hungry; we implemented the first year of our "Opera on the Go" program;
 and for the first time in our merged history, we had a double-concert set, including
 a Sunday matinee performance, featuring our Principal Conductor and Artistic
 Advisor Ari Pelto and our remarkably talented musicians.

As we look ahead to our 2025-26 season, the future is incredibly bright. More double-concert sets, including two performances of *La Traviata* and Beethoven Symphony No. 9; deeper civic partnerships and connections, including performing the music for the Nutcracker and Sleeping Beauty with the Sacramento Ballet; additional projects, including Harry Potter and the Prisoner of Azkaban, Final Fantasy, and a Chamber Opera set for the first time; and the continued enrichment of thousands of students through Link Up and Opera on the Go. These programs, guided by our new Strategic Plan that begins next year, position the SP&O as a thriving cultural organization that meets the needs of our Sacramento community that we serve. We are all very excited to work with you in making everything possible.

I look forward to seeing you at the Performing Arts Center starting in October. Thank you so much for your belief in our mission!
